THE POWER OF WOMEN'S VOICES

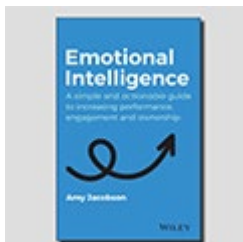
