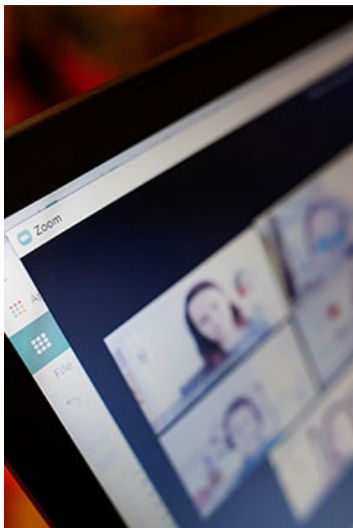

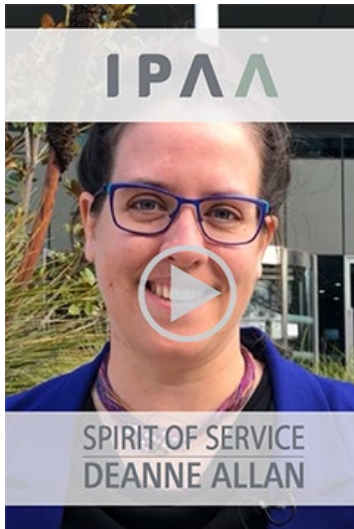
WHAT DIGITAL PLATFORMS CAN YOU ACCESS?
