IS AUSTRALIA STILL THE LUCKY COUNTRY?

Democracy 2025 recently published <u>Is Australia still the lucky country?</u>, a report on political trust in times of COVID-19. It finds that for the first time in over a decade, Australians are exhibiting high levels of political trust in federal government (54 per cent from 29 per cent), and the Australian Public Service (54 per cent from 38 per cent).
