

HOW DO YOU FEEL ABOUT THE NEW NORMAL?

Thanks to everyone who participated in our 'Joys and Challenges' survey last week. We're heartened by how many of you are taking positives out of this crisis. Here's a snapshot of some of what you shared with us:

- 78% are enjoying the flexibility of working from home.
- 62% are exercising more.
- 60% love the extra time with their family.

But aspects of COVID-19 are still of concern to many:

- 52% feel anxious about the state of the world.
- 48% are feeling isolated and disconnected.
- 29% are struggling with the WFH balancing act.
